

**INDIANA UNIVERSITY EAST-EARLHAM COLLEGE
COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR THE BACHELORS DEGREE
IN ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY EDUCATION
(Under Review)**

ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION AT EITHER INSTITUTION:

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
2. (a) Have successfully passed competency tests in math, reading, and writing.

or

(b) Have passed Humanities I, II, and III with a 3.0 or better.

(c) Have successfully completed Educ W200 Computer Literacy

3. (a) for secondary students:
Have completed one course in the Education Department at Earlham with a 3.0 or better

or

Have completed W131 Freshman Composition and S121 Public Speaking with a C+ or better in each course. (Humanities I, II, & III, 3.0) Students not meeting this standard will be required to complete an additional course in the area of deficiency with a B- or better.

P250 General Educational Psychology and P255 Educational Psychology for Secondary Teachers (Educ. 50) with an average of 2.5 or better.

M300 Teaching in a Pluralistic Society (Educ. 70) and H340 Education and American Culture (Educ. 11) with an average of 2.5 or better and at least 12 semester hours in the major with an average of 2.5 or better

- (b) for elementary students:

Have completed W131 Freshman Composition and S121 Public Speaking with a C+ or better in each course. (Humanities I, II, or III)

Students not meeting this standard will be required to complete an additional course in the area of deficiency with a B- or better.

P250 General Educational Psychology and P251/4 Educational Psychology for Elementary Teachers with an average of 2.5 or better.

H340 Education and American Culture

Q200 Basic Science Skills

T101 Arithmetic for Teachers

H105 or H106 American History (History 21), and

E241 Music Fundamentals (Music 11) with an average of 2.5 or better.

(c) All students must have a satisfactory grade in M101 Lab/Field Experience or the practicum associated with Education

4. Have approval of faculty advisor

RETENTION IN TEACHER EDUCATION AT EITHER INSTITUTION:

1. Maintain an overall GPA of 2.5 or better.
2. Demonstrate satisfactory progress in the area of professional knowledge and competence by:
 - (a) Maintaining a 3.0 GPA in professional education courses and no less than a C+ in each course after being accepted into teacher education.
 - (b) No grade lower than C accepted in field of concentration (for Elementary this equals Education courses; for Secondary it equals Education and Major courses).
 - (c) Successfully completing all lab/field experiences and practicum's.

3. Maintain standards of appropriate social, ethical, and academic conduct.

ACCEPTANCE FOR STUDENT TEACHING AT EITHER INSTITUTION:

To be accepted for Student Teaching, a student must:

1. have met all standards for admission to and retention in the teacher education program.
2. have attained senior standing and completed at least three fourths of the courses required in any certification area.
3. have successfully completed all prescribed professional courses needed for student teaching.
4. have maintained a 2.5 grade point average or better in each general education area and a 2.5 GPA or better in each certification area.
5. have an overall GPA of 2.7.
6. have successfully completed all required early field experiences.
7. have successfully passed all three sections of the NTE Core Battery (Professional Knowledge, General Knowledge, and Communication Skills).
8. (a) have the approval of the faculty advisor, the secondary consultant in the area of certification, the convener of the Education Department, and the appropriate personnel in the cooperating school district.

or

(b) have the approval of the faculty advisor, the Director of Clinical Experiences on the Indiana University East campus and the appropriate personnel in the cooperating school district

9. All students in the teacher education program are required to apply for student teaching no later than December 1 of the academic year preceding their application for placement through Indiana University East or no later than the spring term of the student's junior year if applying for placement through Earlham College. (See the respective faculty advisors in teacher education on each campus for specific requirements for placement.)

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION WITH CERTIFICATION AT EITHER INSTITUTION:

1. Have successfully passed an exit exam such as the NTE Specialty Test or the GRE Education Test.
2. Have the approval of the education faculty on the campus from which the degree is being granted and the approval of the certification officer on the campus from which the student is receiving certification.
3. Have an overall GPA of 2.7 or higher.
4. Have successfully completed all requirements for the Bachelor of Science or the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary or Secondary Education.
