ARTICULATION AGREEMENT SINCLAIR COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND INDIANA UNIVERSITY EAST 1997

Purpose of Articulation: The Indiana University East Division of Education and the Sinclair Community College Liberal Arts Department have developed an articulation agreement so that students completing their associate's degree at Sinclair can transfer into the Elementary and Secondary programs offered by Indiana University East (IUE). Both institutions are committed to serving undergraduate students in preparation for careers which will, in most instances, keep them in the area. This is a region shared by both institutions yet artificially separated by State borders. Students living in Darke and Preble counties of Ohio need all of the options available to them to pursue higher education and this agreement is another possibility for them. During times of shrinking resources it is essential that institutions work cooperatively to bring to students high quality educational opportunities. It is in this spirit that Indiana University East and Sinclair Community College offer this agreement and it is in this spirit of cooperation that these institutions hope for continuing relationships.

Numbers of Students and Acceptance into the IUE Division of Education: Sinclair Community College students interested in participating in the articulation agreement will need to submit a letter stating their interest, a transcript and three letters of recommendations, two of which must be from Sinclair faculty. All applications will be reviewed by the Education Division Admissions Committee. All candidates must meet University retention standards as well as Division of Education program requirements. A maximum of 15 Sinclair Community College students will be admitted to the Indiana University East Division of Education per year.

Financial Arrangements: The financial arrangements for Sinclair College students participating in this program after completing their associate's degree and after being accepted by Indiana University East include the following:

1. Indiana University East nonresident undergraduate instructional fee rate will be billed to the student.
2. Indiana University East will provide a fee remission to the student for the difference between the Indiana University Trustee approved nonresident undergraduate fee rate and the net price to the student.
3. The net price to the student will be \$160 per credit hour for the

1997-98 year.

4. For years following 1997-98, the net price will be increased at a rate equal to Trustee approved increases in the Indiana University nonresident undergraduate instructional fee rate.

Degree and Endorsements Attainable: Upon graduation from Indiana University East, a Sinclair Community College Articulation student would have a Bachelor of Science degree from IUE and an Indiana state teaching license. Upon applying for Ohio certification, under regulations in existence at the signing of this document, they would receive an additional Reading Endorsement. This is a result of the differences between Indiana and Ohio certification requirements.

Articulation Assessment: Following the initial two year period of enrollment, there will be an evaluation of the success of the program by both institutions and a decision will be made as to whether to continue it or not. Assessment will include, but not be limited to, student success in the education program, impact of Sinclair students on WE education class size, and faculty input. Courses will continue to be reviewed on an as needed basis.

Note: Upon entering IUE students are accepted into the Division of Education. Upon completion of all requirements they will apply for admittance into the Teacher Education Program. Current requirements for admission to Teacher Education are attached to this document.
