

The IU Board of Trustees and University Counsel have reviewed our Post-Tenure Review and Faculty Board of Review documents. They have requested that the following changes be made for their approval.

1. Post-Tenure Review: Revision to Circular E6-00

Add

**VII.G. The procedures for dismissing faculty for misconduct or incompetence are separate from these policies and may be invoked, when appropriate, at any time; dismissal policies supercede the Post-Tenure Review policy.**

2. Two amendments to I.U East Faculty Senate By-laws, Section V.B.1. Faculty Board of Review

a) Section “B.1.a.iv.c” currently states:

In cases of non-reappointment, salary adjustment, or any other...of receipt of notice (For cases of dismissal see Section B.1.a).

The reference is incorrect; it should state:

In cases of non-reappointment, salary adjustment, or any other...of receipt of notice (**For cases of dismissal see B.1.b.i**).

b) Section “B.1.b.i.f” currently states:

- f) The findings and recommendations of the Board of Review shall be communicated promptly in writing to the affected faculty member and to the Chancellor of Indiana University East and/or the President of Indiana University, who shall inform the Board of Trustees of the action of the Board of Review. The final decision of the Board of Trustees shall be made with reasonable promptness, and it shall be communicated by the Chancellor or President to the affected faculty member in a registered letter.

It is proposed to be revised to state only IUE procedures as indicated:

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- f) The findings and recommendations of the Board of Review shall be communicated promptly in writing to the affected faculty member and to the Chancellor of Indiana University East. The final decision of the **Chancellor of Indiana University East** shall be made with reasonable promptness, and it shall be communicated by the Chancellor to the affected faculty member in a registered letter, **with a copy to the Faculty Board of Review. Faculty wishing to appeal this final decision of the Chancellor should consult the Indiana University Academic Handbook.**

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
