Standard of Student Conduct

A student enrolling in the University assumes an obligation to conduct himself/herself in a manner compatible with the University's function as an educational institution. As any other citizen, a student has rights and obligations. Each student is responsible for his/her personal conduct under federal, state, and local law; and his/her status as a student neither excuses nor protects him/her from civil and criminal sanctions. All faculty members have the responsibility and general authority to help preserve order and integrity at the campus, especially in their classes.

Cases of student activity reflecting discredit upon the student or on the University which the faculty member thinks he/she cannot handle satisfactorily or which should be made a matter of record will be reported to the Dean of Students, who will take action according to the Code of Students' Rights, Responsibilities, and Conduct established by the Board of Trustees.
