**Exemption Policy for Institutional Mathematics Requirement**

This policy defines under which circumstances exemptions from the institutional mathematics requirement are made.

**1. Exemption with credit.**

Indiana University awards credit for courses as a result of an examination (e.g., CLEP and AP tests), and the applicable fee: (a) during the first or second consecutive semester of matriculation there is no charge; (b) if the student is a first semester transfer student there is a \$10 per credit hour charge; (c) otherwise the student will pay the standard per semester fee at the applicable resident or nonresident rate. (see IU East Bulletin)

**2. Exemption without credit.**

Exemptions without credit are made for students who have demonstrated proficiency in college level mathematics through a testing program. This may be done in one of the following ways: (a) placement into Math M126 (Trigonometric Functions), Math M215 (Analytic Geometry and Calculus I) or higher through Compass testing; (b) a SAT Math score of 670 or better or ACT math score of 27 or better (i.e., scores above the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile on the mathematics section; (c) an AP Calculus score of 4 or 5.
