The primary purpose of the BSW Program is to prepare students for beginning generalist practice at the entry level. The curriculum for the BSW degree consists of a minimum of 122 credit hours provided through required and elective courses. Of these 122 credit hours, 42-43 credit hours are devoted to general/supportive liberal arts courses and 51 credit hours to social work courses. The remainder required credit hours are earned through elective courses.

It is the students' responsibility to assure that they have taken the required liberal arts and social work courses.

- For continuance in and graduation from the BSW program students are required:
- a) to maintain a minimum semester grade GPA of 2.0 and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all courses;
  - b) to maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all required social work courses;
  - c) to attain a minimum grad of C (2.0) in each required social work course;
  - d) to carry out professional activity in a manner which is in conformity with the values and ethics of the profession.

Students can take a maximum of four elective courses as Pass-Fail (P/F). All general requirements and supportive area requirements need a letter grade. All required social work courses receive a letter grade with the exception of the Social Work Practicum II which is graded on a Satisfactory-Fail (S/F) basis. Pass-Fail policy does not apply to courses in which the student has "tested out" or been granted special credit.

A maximum of six courses taken by correspondence may be applied toward completion of the BSW course requirements. Of these no more than four courses can be allowed in the general requirements and no more than two in the supportive area requirements.

## Requirements for Admission

### Requirements for admission to the program:

- Regular admission to the University
- Completion of at least **12 credit hours**
- Complete **S141**, receiving a grade of **C or above**
- Cumulative grade point average of 2.5**
- Submission of completed **application** (available in Social Work Program office, TR150)
- 3 references** (at least one must be academic and one professional)
- Evidence of characteristics or potential** required for competent social work practice.

## Practicum's

### Two Practicum's are required:

**SWK-S 381 (Social Work Practicum I):** taken in the **Spring of the Junior year**. Requires 15 hours working/studying in an agency under the supervision of a Social Worker in addition to attending class seminars. Course grade is a combination of Agency (40%) and Seminar performance (60%).

**SWK-S 482 (Social Work Practicum II):** taken in the **Fall of the Senior year**. It requires 20 hours a week working/studying in an agency under the supervision of a Social Worker. Five hours credit received for this course, the grade is S-F.

## Correspondence Courses

**A total of six courses can be taken by correspondence**, no more than four courses can be allowed in the general education requirements and no more than two courses in the supportive area requirements.

A total of four courses can be taken Pass-Fail (in addition to senior practicum). These courses must be electives. All other courses require a grade.
