II. Foreign Language (0-14 credit hours through sophomore level*)

**Foreign language required through the sophomore level (4 semesters). Some students who have had foreign language training on the high school level or have native fluency may be exempted from one or more courses through competency testing or successful completion of the second semester of the foreign language course sequence. Students may meet the foreign language requirement in the following ways: 1) four courses in sequence in one foreign language 2) three courses in foreign language (at least two in sequence in one foreign language) and one foreign language culture course taught in English 3) two courses in sequence in one foreign language and two courses in sequence in a second foreign language 4) two course in sequence in one foreign language and two foreign language culture courses taught in English. Students who have been exempted from foreign language courses may choose elective courses to meet the credit requirement for their degree.*
