

MINOR IN SOCIOLOGY

Purpose: The Sociology Minor is designed to:

- A. Support and enhance a variety of baccalaureate majors;
- B. Provide recognition to those students who enjoy Sociology and wish to complete a series of classes, regardless of their major, and
- C. Offer students interested in Sociology a group of courses which can become the basis of a concentration in Sociology within the Bachelor of Science in Behavioral and Social Sciences.

Requirements: The minor in Sociology requires 19 hours of coursework with a "C" (2.0) or better in each Sociology class.

Required: S100 - Introductory Sociology (3 cr.)
S230 - Society and the Individual (3 cr.)

One of the following:

S210 - Social Organization (3 cr.) or
S215 - Social Change (3 cr.)

(Students may select a course other than one of these only with the consent of a Sociology Minor advisor.)

S340 - Social Theory (3 cr.)

Two additional courses (6 cr. hrs.) at the 300/400 level.

S494 - Field Experience (1 cr.)

(To be taken in conjunction with the sixth and final course of the Sociology Minor sequence. This final course will normally be at the 300/400 level. Any exceptions must be approved by the advisor.)
